Please **DO NOT** blow grass clippings into roadways and alleyways while mowing. It can clog the sewer drains and cause many costly issues!

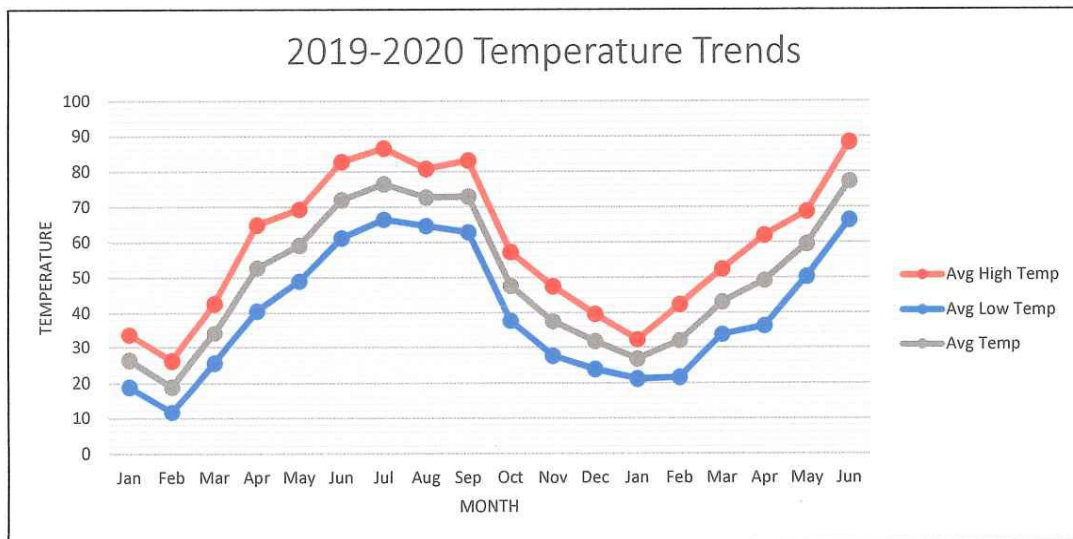
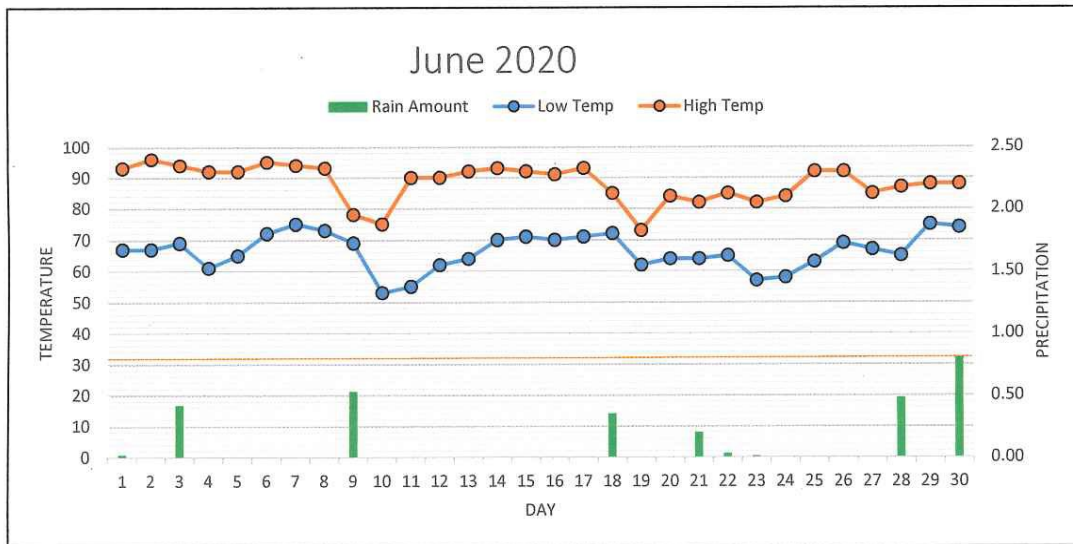

VILLAGE OF BRADSHAW REGULAR MEETING MINUTES – 06-11-2020

The Village of Bradshaw Board of Trustees met in regular session at the Bradshaw Community Center in the lower meeting room and Zoom video conference. Chairman Gordan called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. declaring the meeting to be open, legal, and properly posted with all members having been notified in advance through receipt of packets with agendas two days before the meeting. He announced that a copy of the Open Meetings Law is posted on the west door of the meeting room.

Trustees present: James Gordan, LJ McCormick, Donald Burgener and Terrence Werth. Absent: Brent Driewer.

Werth moved, Burgener seconded, to approve the meeting agenda. MC=4-0.

Werth moved, Burgener seconded, to approve the minutes of the May 14th, 2020 regular meeting, except for changing who opened the meeting to Gordan. MC=4-0.

Clerk advised board that she is still researching how to handle CVA noise. Tabled for next month.

Burgener moved, Werth seconded to approve the audit as presented by Gayle Steiger with Romans, Wiemer & Associates. MC=4-0.

Werth moved, Burgener seconded to begin condemning process on 300 Mitchell Street. MC=4-0

Clerk advised board that there will be a rate study done on water and sewer for free from Nebraska Rural Water Association and will be presented to the board at July's meeting.

Board discussed complaint received from resident. Werth moved, Gordan seconded a response letter to be sent to resident. MC=4-0.

Burgener moved, Gordan seconded to approve firework's stand by Adam Kreifels. MC=4-0.
