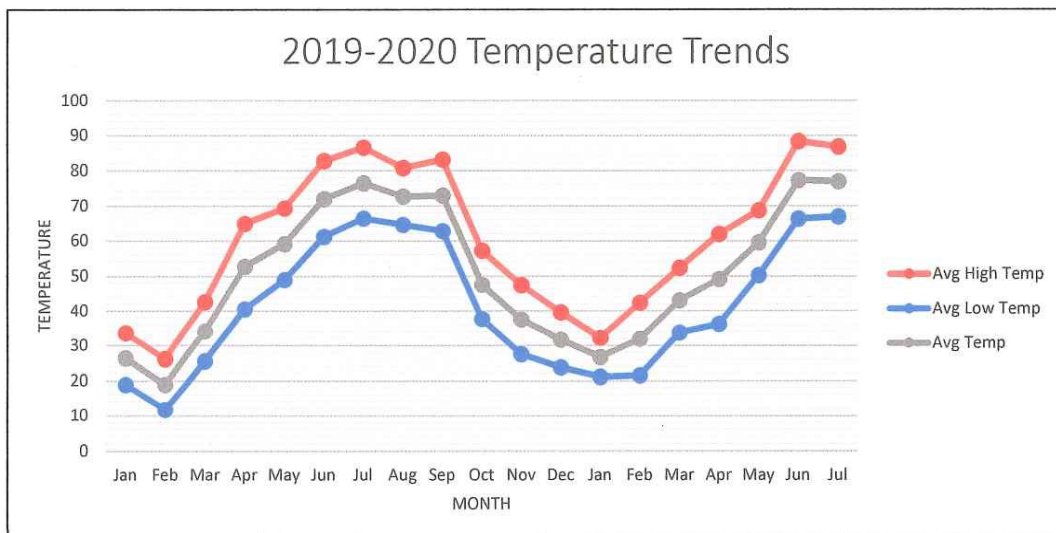
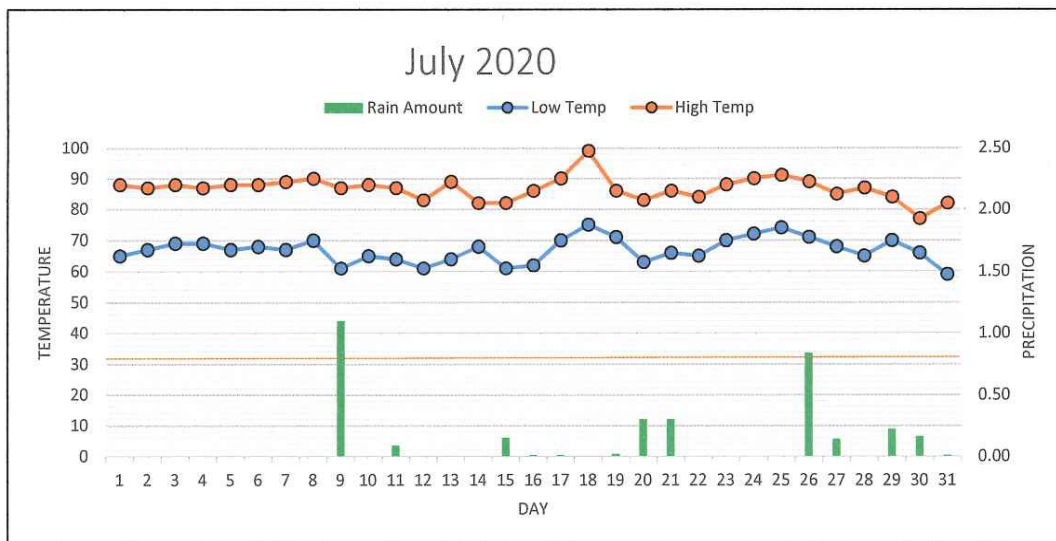
Please **DO NOT** blow grass clippings into roadways and alleyways while mowing. It can clog the sewer drains and cause many costly issues!

VILLAGE OF BRADSHAW REGULAR MEETING MINUTES – 07-09-2020

The Village of Bradshaw Board of Trustees met in regular session at the Bradshaw Community Center in the lower meeting room. Chairman Gordan called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. declaring the meeting to be open, legal, and properly posted with all members having been notified in advance through receipt of packets with agendas two days before the meeting. He announced that a copy of the Open Meetings Law is posted on the west door of the meeting room.

Trustees present: James Gordan, Donald Burgener and Terrence Werth. Absent: Brent Driewer, LJ McCormick.

Werth moved, Burgener seconded, to approve the meeting agenda. MC=3-0.

Werth moved, Burgener seconded, to approve the minutes of the June 11th, 2020 regular meeting. MC=3-0.

After review of the Treasurer's Report prepared by clerk Gordan moved, Burgener seconded to approve as presented. Advised clerk to manually add sales tax into next month's report. MC=3-0

Werth moved, Burgener seconded, to approve the payroll and warrants as presented. MC=3-0. Randy Hellbusch with Nebraska Rural Water Association presented the suggested water & sewer rates calculated from the recent rate study. Board tabled discussion for August board meeting.

Pam Kaliff discussed a possible idea for banner's with veteran's pictures to hang around the village. Board discussed possibility and possibility of getting military branch flags. Tables for next month's meeting.

Werth moved, Burgener seconded to approve Robert & Vernalene Hoffman's request to subdivide lot. MC=3-0.

Board discussed different zoning concerns around the village. Advised clerk to contact the Planning Commission to have a meeting to update the zoning map & give recommendations on whether to re-zone 105 Lincoln Street.

Clerk advised board of issue on the sale of the lot's north of the school. Werth moved, Burgener seconded to file an addendum to the purchase agreement and add additional charge for remaining property to \$19,996. MC=3-0

Board advised clerk to check rates & possibly negotiate rate for August CD's coming due.

The Clerk's report: advised of delinquent accounts and KWH usage vs. billed KWH from NPPD. Board agreed to start budget workshops July 30th if it works for absent board members.

Superintendent advised board of water leaks at RV Park. Board advised him to get bids for possibly seal coating Lincoln Street.

Bradshaw Beat items: no grass clippings in roads & alleys, clean up after dogs.

Burgener moved, Werth seconded, adjournment at 8:41p.m. MC=3-0.

The next meeting will be held in the Bradshaw Community Center meeting room on Thursday, August 13th, 2020 at 7 pm. The public is always welcome.
