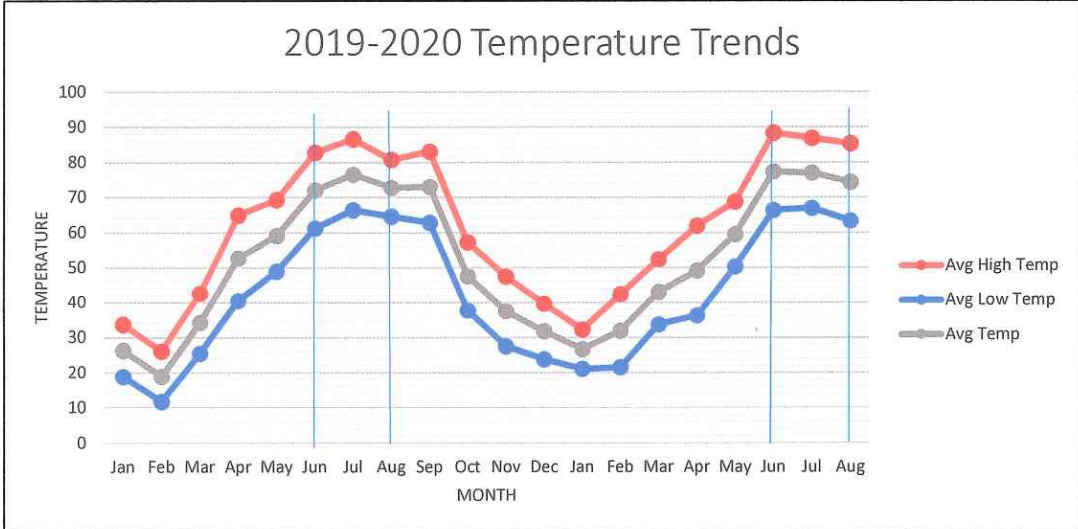
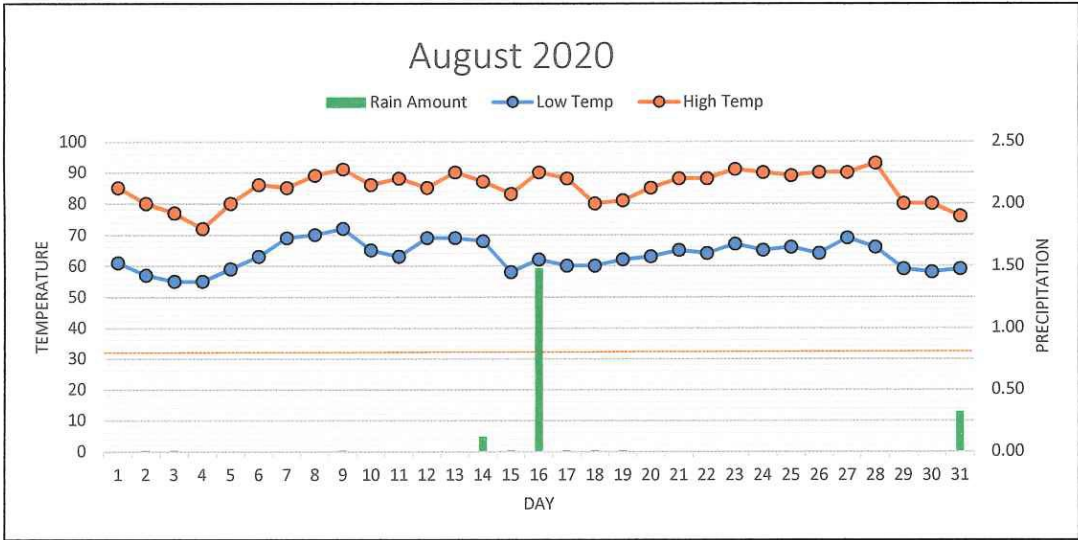

VILLAGE OF BRADSHAW REGULAR MEETING MINUTES – 08-13-2020

The Village of Bradshaw Board of Trustees met in regular session at the Bradshaw Community Center in the lower meeting room. Chairman Gordan called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. declaring the meeting to be open, legal, and properly posted with all members having been notified in advance through receipt of packets with agendas two days before the meeting. He announced that a copy of the Open Meetings Law is posted on the west door of the meeting room.

Trustees present: James Gordan, Donald Burgener, Brent Driewer and Terrence Werth. Absent: LJ McCormick.

Werth moved, Burgener seconded, to approve the meeting agenda. MC=4-0.

Burgener moved, Werth seconded, to approve the minutes of the July 9th, 2020 regular meeting. MC=3-1. Driewer abstained.

Gordan moved, Driewer seconded, to approve the minutes of the August 6th, 2020 special meeting. MC=4-0.

Werth moved, Burgener seconded to approve the sewer rate suggestions from Nebraska Rural Water Association pending ordinance reading to come in September. Rates would be single-\$8.50, family-\$12.00, commercial-\$16.00, bar-\$15.00 and Klute's-32.00 MC=4-0

Driewer moved, Werth seconded to approve the water rate suggestions from Nebraska Rural Water Association pending ordinance reading to come in September. Rates to increase over 3-year period. Year 1-base rate \$20.00 & \$2.00/1000 gallons used, year 2-base rate \$22.00 & \$2.25/1000 gallons used, year 3-base rate \$24.00 & \$2.50/1000 gallons used. MC=4-0.

Steve Jensen approached the board on interest with the RV park, no actions taken.

Burgener moved, Werth seconded to approve bid from Asphalt Paving for \$22,500 to seal coat Lincoln Street from Highway 34 to Railway Street. MC=4-0.

After review of the Treasurer's Report prepared by clerk Werth moved, Driewer seconded to approve as presented. Clerk to add year to date amounts on each fund going forward. MC=4-0

Driewer moved, Werth seconded, to approve the payroll and warrants as presented. MC=4-0.
